

## ANNEX .MUSIC - SPECIAL CONDITIONS FOR THE .MUSIC TLD

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In addition to Gandi's [Domain name registration contract](#), the registration and use of a .MUSIC domain name implies the acceptance of and compliance to the present special conditions contained herein.

All legal information and contracts can be viewed at any time via Our [website](#). Capitalized terms have the definition attributed to them in Our [Domain name registration contract](#). Specifically, “You” refers to the owner of the domain name, and “We” designates Gandi.

### Section .MUSIC.1. Naming organization

.MUSIC is a generic Top-Level-Domain (gTLD) dedicated to the global music community and industry.

### Section .MUSIC.2. Registration policies

When You apply to register a .MUSIC domain name, You acknowledge that You have fully understood and You have full knowledge of, and You agree to abide by all the rules and specific conditions of .MUSIC domain names, as defined by ICANN and DotMusic Limited, and which may be viewed at the following pages:

These policies, that You acknowledge to have fully understood and to have accepted via Our website bind You to the .MUSIC Registry. The present special conditions do not replace these rules, which are incorporated by reference, and are binding on Gandi and You.

### Section .MUSIC.3. Special requirements

The .MUSIC is an extension reserved to the music community and industry. The purpose of the .MUSIC is to help strengthen the cultural and social identity of the music community members. As such, .MUSIC Registry has set up a set of eligibility and domain name selection rules.

### 3.1. Registrant Eligibility

The following individuals and legal entities are eligible to register a .MUSIC domain name:

1. Established Music Community and Music Industry Classification. Individuals and entities that can attest and document that they possess one or more more of the following requirements and attributes:

- **Music Intellectual Property.** Individuals and entities with music-related trademarks, copyrights, and patents.
- **Music Community Members.** Members of a Music Community Member Organizations (MCMO), including musicians, bands, creators, music industry professionals, and music-related organizations.
- **Musicians, Artists/Bands and Creators.** Individuals and groups of individuals with a history of music-related activity, which includes but is not limited to, work as an artist, band, songwriter, composer, or producer.
- **Music Based Business, Corporation and Organization.** Entities that have an established presence in the music community, which includes labels, publishers, trade associations, collective management organizations, performing rights organizations, digital distributors, service providers, vendors, and educational providers.
- **Consultants, Agents, Managers or Professionals** working on behalf of previous classes with documented support and/or contracts verifying the relationship.

2. Individuals and entities that do not have a documented history of one or more of the requirements and attributes in the above section, but can attest a general nexus to the music community:

- **Non-Music Based Businesses, Corporations and Organizations.** Established businesses with a strong commercial history outside of the music industry that wish to use music as part of their future business, marketing, promotional activities.
- **Aspiring Musicians, Artists/Bands and Creators.** Individuals and groups of individuals with a demonstrable intention to create music-related activity, which includes but is not limited to, work as an artist, band, songwriter, composer, or producer.

### 3.2. Verification procedure

A non-enumerated list of documents may be requested to provide and establish eligibility. Failure to provide requested documentation may result in the deletion of the domain name without a refund.

Following the domain name registration, You will receive an email from the Registry with a link to the verification process.

Both verification of identity and music profile information is required to be eligible for a .MUSIC domain name:

- **Registrant Identity Verification.** After registration of a domain name, registrants must complete an identity verification through the Registry's Identity Verification Solution Provider (IVSP).
- **Music Profile and Nexus Verification.** To complete the identification process, music profile information and data will be required at the IVSP. This information is used to determine a “Music Score” and “Nexus Score”.
- **“Music Score”** (Article 4.0 of Name Selection Policy). Members of the music community can be recognized and identified by works, contractual engagements, social connections and profile.

The Registry will generate a metric, called “Music Score”, from these attributes analyzed through its ISVP. The “Music Score” will be used as a measure of the registrant’s connection and history in the music community.

- **“Nexus Score”** (Article 5.0 of Name Selection Policy). The Registry will try to quantify and determine a nexus between the registrant and the domain name registered, through its ISVP. This “Nexus Score” will be used as a determinant for the suitability and legitimacy of a registrant to register a specific domain name.
- **.MUSIC domain names will be placed under a Registry Server Hold Status** (domain name not resolving) until the verification are completed.
- **Failure to Verify**. After the registration of a .MUSIC domain name, the registrant has 90 days to complete these verification. Failure to complete both verification, the registrant becomes ineligible and the Registry at its discretion may revoke the .MUSIC domain name(s) without a refund or put the domain name(s) under Music Community Protection Lock in accordance with the Anti-Abuse and Legitimate Use Policy.

You must remain eligible throughout the registration of Your domain. The .MUSIC Registry with its verification partners will review this eligibility regularly every year the domain name is registered.

### 3.3. Name selection rules

Registrants must be able to demonstrate that they have a clear and obvious nexus to the domain name string they are registering.

.MUSIC domain names have special requirements according to the class the domain falls into:

- **Standard names:** domain names are subject to “Music Score” and “Nexus Score”.
- **Community Names:** Community Names are those words or phrases commonly used by a significant number of organizations within the music community (e.g. label, band, artist). Domain names must correspond to a historically established common law name, trademark, brand, service name or mark that is commonly used and understood with the music community or corresponds to a commercial trademark, trade name or service mark of a business or organization known in the music community, and have a significant “Music Score” and “Nexus Score”.
- **Generic Names:** Generic Names are those words or phrases commonly used within the music community to identify products, services, and other transactional and are not specific to any particular source. These names will initially not be available for registration, but they may be made available case by case. If You want to register a Generic Name, please contact Our support team so they can assist You to submit Your request to the Registry.
- **Reserved Names:** these names are not available for registration.

In any case the domain name must not be likely to deceive, confuse or cause material detriment to a significant portion of the music community, its customers or Internet users.

### 3.4. Use of the domain name

Content and use is restricted to music-related content and activities.

You must use consistently Your domain name only for legitimate purposes that promote, create, innovate, the global music industry or music community in accordance with all applicable laws, regulations, and industry/community standards.

Buying and holding of .MUSIC domain names for reselling, especially in bulk is prohibited.

Those wishing to manage large multiples of .MUSIC domain names, must register with the ISVP as an Industry Class registrant under subsection Music Based Business, Corporation and Organization to gain special permission to manage a large quantity of .MUSIC domain names. Violation of the domain name warehousing provision may result in the deletion of all domain names connected with the registrant without refund.

### Section .MUSIC.4. “Trademark Claim Notice” period

In accordance with ICANN rules, during Music Community Organization Phase and at least 90 days upon general opening, a “Trademark Claim Notice” period will run.

During this period if the domain name for which You requested registration is identical to a trademark that is registered and validated with TMCH (according to the “labels” generated), You will receive a warning notice (“Trademark Claim Notice”) in real time on Our interface informing You that a third party has rights to the domain name You requested.

You must confirm or cancel Your registration request, with full knowledge of the notice and its consequences. It being specified that if You do not confirm the notice, Your request will not be sent to the Registry.

If You confirm Your registration request, third parties who own an identical mark are notified of Your registration.

### Section .MUSIC.5. Reserved names

Some words are specifically reserved or prohibited by ICANN, in particular:

Registry might at any time change the classification of a domain name.

### Section .MUSIC.6. Registration term

The registration term is from 1 to 10 years. To avoid any deactivation of the domain name, the renewal must be paid and funds cleared before the Expiration date.

### Section .MUSIC .8. Personal data

You consent to the collect, use, copying, distribution, publication, in particular in the Registry public [Whois](#) database if applicable, modification and other processing of Your personal data by the Registry, its technical provider and their designees and agents for the purposes of providing Registry services as defined in the Registry agreement with ICANN and in accordance with the Registry privacy policy.

### Section .MUSIC.9. Dispute resolution policy

The Registry has adopted the ICANN dispute resolution procedures UDRP (Uniform Dispute Resolution Policy) and URS (Uniform Rapid Suspension System) for .MUSIC domains, that You agree fully abide by.

### **Section .MUSIC.10. Transfer (change of Registrar)**

The transfer-in process may be initiated on Our Interface. Before requesting the transfer of the domain name, please make sure You have the domain's authorization code (supplied by Your current Registrar), and that Your domain name:

- does not have a TransferProhibited status,
- does not expire soon (We recommend that You start the transfer request at least 1 month prior to its Expiration),
- was created at least 60 days prior to the request,
- has not been transferred within the last 60 days.

Upon successfully transferring a domain name, the registration period is extended by 1 year.

### **Section .MUSIC.11. Ownership change**

The ownership change process is available on Our Interface and requires the confirmation of both parties by e-mail.

The owner change of a domain name does not change the Expiration date.

### **Section .MUSIC.12. Deletion process**

Upon the Expiration of the domain name, We suspend (Hold) the domain name for 45 days, during which time all associated technical services are deactivated. Late renewal at normal price is possible during this period.

Then the domain name goes into Redemption Period for an additional 30 days. It can only be restored during this period in accordance with the terms and conditions described on Our website and/or as communicated by Our customer service department.

If the domain name is neither renewed nor restored within these deadlines, the Registry shall place the domain name in "Pending Delete" status for several days, and then delete the domain name, which will become available for registration on a "first-come first-served" basis.

### **Section .MUSIC.13. Registrant obligations**

You agree to provide and maintain accurate, reliable and up-to-date personal contact information. Failing to do so, the Registry may suspend and/or delete Your domain name.

You have to comply with all applicable laws, including those that relate to privacy, data collection, consumer protection (including in relation to misleading and deceptive conduct), fair lending, debt collection, organic farming, disclosure of data, and financial disclosures.

To the extent You collect and maintain sensitive health and financial data, You have to implement reasonable and appropriate security measures commensurate with the offering of those services, as

defined by applicable law.

You acknowledge and agree that distributing malware, abusively operating botnets, phishing, piracy, trademark or copyright infringement, fraudulent or deceptive practices, counterfeiting or otherwise engaging in activity contrary to applicable law are expressly prohibited. Failing to comply with this provision, You expose Yourself to the suspension of Your domain name, in addition to the prosecution for the prejudice caused to third parties and to the penalties mentioned under applicable law.

To the extent permitted by applicable law, You commit Yourself to indemnify, defend and hold harmless Registry, its parent company and subcontractors, and its and their directors, officers, employees, agents, and affiliates from and against any and all claims, damages, liabilities, costs and expenses, including reasonable legal fees and expenses arising out of or relating to, for any reason whatsoever, the registration of Your domain name. This indemnification obligation shall survive the termination or expiration of the present agreement.

### **Section .MUSIC.14. Rights of the Registry**

You acknowledge and accept that the Registry reserves the right to deny, cancel or transfer any registration or transaction, or place any domain name on registry lock, hold (suspension), or similar status as it deems necessary, in its unlimited and sole discretion:

- to comply with specifications adopted by any industry group generally recognized as authoritative with respect to the Internet (e.g., RFCs), the music industry and the music community,
- to correct mistakes made by the Registry or any registrar in connection with a domain name registration,
- to protect the rights and property of the Registry and to avoid any potential or actual liability, civil or criminal, on the part of the Registry as well as its affiliates, subsidiaries, officers, directors, representatives, employees, members and stockholders,
- to protect the integrity, security and stability of the Registry and domain name system,
- to comply with all applicable court order, laws, government rules or requirements, requests of law enforcement or other governmental agency or organization, or any applicable dispute resolution process,
- for violation of the terms and conditions set forth in the present agreement,
- to respond to or protect against any form of malware (defined to include, without limitation, malicious code or software that might affect the operation of .MUSIC extension, the Internet or which cause direct or material harm to others),
- for non-payment of fees.

The Registry also reserves the right to place Your domain name in « lock » status, « hold » status or similar status during resolution of a dispute.

You agree to comply with the terms and conditions of the launch of the .MUSIC extension (including without limitation all of the applicable periods defined in the Registry Startup Plan) and further acknowledge that Registry has no liability of any kind for any loss or liability resulting from the proceedings and processes relating to any of the applicable registration periods defined in the Startup Policy, including, without limitation:

- the ability or inability of a registrant to obtain a domain name during the launch periods, and
- the results of any dispute over registrations that are an identical match to trademarks listed in the Trademark Clearinghouse.

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
